HELPING VHOCC AND SAVING ON TAXES

Now that tax season has come and gone, it might be appropriate to plan for 2011-2012. There are several ways you can save on taxes and benefit VHOCC:

1-If you are over 70-1/2, you can make a tax free charitable gift from your individual retirement accounts. Your gift to VHOCC will count toward your required minimum distribution but will not be added to your adjusted gross income. Therefore it will not be taxed. Gifts of any size will benefit our services.

2-You can contribute to VHOCC by direct cash gifts and bequests in your will. Other ways to gift could be donating appreciated securities (shares of stock that have grown in value are fully deductible. If owned over a year, you may deduct the full market value of the shares without paying capital gains tax on your appreciation).

3-You can also sell depreciated securities (stocks), claim a tax loss and then contribute the cash proceeds and claim a charitable deduction for your gift.

4-You could name VHOCC as a beneficiary of your life insurance policy. Upon your death the policy, proceeds will be distributed and will not be taxed as part of your estate.

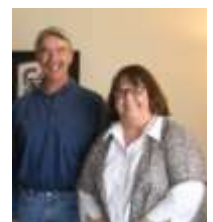
The Spring Community Education Series in Sequim was held at Trinity United Methodist Church. We had 30-37 persons attend each of the six sessions. Our attendees were a combination of those already volunteering, those deciding if they might choose to be volunteers, some are full-time caregivers seeking more information, and other interested persons in the community. The topics ranged from Introduction to Hospice, presented by Sue Hynes, Executive Director; Attitudes about Death and Dying, presented by volunteer, Gary Lepak; Grief, presented by volunteer, Cherie Copsey; Families dealing with Death and Dying, presented by Beth Garifalos, MSW; Legal Aspects, presented by Ron Bell, Attorney, Mortuary Services, presented by Jennifer Melberg; and Stress Management presented by Ruth Marcus, PhD.

As we have done for the past few years, we offer a 7th session for those who want to be "hands on" volunteers. This meeting is held at the Hospice office. Our RNs will be present with home health equipment to instruct on the movement of patients in a manner safe for both patient and volunteers. Each volunteer will practice being a patient and a caregiver. Volunteer, Jim Mann will discuss making a home visit and our mentoring program for new volunteers.

The Community Education Series will be offered again in the Fall in Port Angeles. As always, it will be free and open to the public. Watch for more information or call the VHOCC office.

Brainstorming

Hospice volunteers attended the Annual Alzheimer's Regional Conference in March in Seattle. The conference (Brainstorming) was sponsored by the National Alzheimer's Association. A pre-conference symposium on Leadership/Marketing was attended by Pam Gates, Ken Brown and Mary Brown. They were joined the following day by Sue Hynes, Marty Melcher and Brian Murphy. Also attending was Rhonda Carroll, Director of Caregivers Home Health. VHOCC uses personnel from Caregivers for patient care. VHOCC will provide training for volunteer caregivers in caring for the late-stage Alzheimer's patient.



DEALING WITH THE UNIMAGINABLE

They were a loving couple who together had faced the joys and sorrows that life inevitably bestowed upon them during a marriage that had spanned many years. And then, as sudden as a storm can change a sunny day, the husband found himself assuming a tireless role of caring for his wife. With each passing day he inherited more of the tasks that his wife had once donepay the bills, do the housekeeping, do the laundry, make the meals. Isn't it odd how we don't recognize all that our partner does for us until they are no longer able to do so. It's a difficult adjustment even when you expect it. As time passed, his wife became less communicative, her balance got worse, she forgot the names of important people and her memories faded. She could no longer dress, bathe or toilet herself. He did it all for her, and although her care needs grew, he didn't want to leave her in the care of anyone else. After all, she had always been there for him. As time progressed, she didn't get out of bed much anymore, she mumbled and couldn't speak coherently and when he attempted to feed her, she pocketed her food in her mouth, unable to swallow. She became so thin and infections occurred in her lungs, kidneys and on her skin from incontinence and laying in bed. He recalled how she loved to sing to their grandchildren, and now he sings to comfort her. He longs for the woman she once was before this brain crippling disease over-came her. He believes the woman he knew is still there and yet his feelings go from sadness to anger.

This story is hypothetical but is typical of the stories I've heard told by family caregivers for victims of Alzheimer's, dementia and other degenerative brain diseases. VHOCC was the fortunate recipient of a donation from the Halberg family in memory of Dorothy Duncan to help us learn more about Alzheimer's and dementia so that we can offer support to the patients and their families facing the end stage of those abysmal diseases. Several of our volunteers have received in-depth training in the care of patients afflicted with these diseases, and in turn, they will train other volunteers who are interested. Alzheimer's and dementia will be the focus of our May in-service. We have begun partnerships with other community agencies that work with this type of care and together we hope to form an alliance that will enable us to help those in need. Alzheimer's is the seventh leading cause of death and it is estimated that we will be seeing a 44 percent increase in the number of those afflicted with AD by 2025.

Alzheimer's and dementia are slow progressive diseases that run their course in eight to ten years and lay waste to a person's personality, intellect and ability to function. Of course, we would all like to be able to help the caregiver who has been faced with insurmountable challenges, however, to slow the progression and the reality of limited personnel and financial resources, we can truly only become involved in the final stage of these diseases. Hospice care is appropriate when the patient has ongoing inabilities - is bed bound, non-communicative, loss of bladder and bowel control, unable to perform any self-care and is no longer eating or 'pockets' food resulting in weight loss and poor nutritional status which leads to recurrent infections. We would like to have volunteers trained to help the patient and caregiver with their physical, emotional, social and spiritual concerns during the end of this terminal illness and following the death of the patient. Marty Melcher is an ARNP and one of our hospice nurses who has expressed an interest in working with Alzheimer's and dementia patients and we will be looking to her and others in enabling VHOCC to better respond to AD/dementia patients.

Please feel free to call me to ask questions, to share with us an experience you have had with these diseases or to advise us of any talents, suggestions or concerns that you have regarding AD or dementia.
